

Why is attendance so important? It has a ripple effect on everything in a child's life:

- Students who miss 2 days of school/month are at risk of falling behind academically as compared to their peers. In fact, 2/3 of the children on Agape's caseload have unacceptable attendance rates when we begin working with them.
- Chronically absent students are 7.4 times more likely to drop out of school.
- Parents voiced their need for education for youth (along with safety, health and well being, post-secondary and employment pathways and housing stability).
- Economically disadvantaged children are 3 times more likely to be chronically absent in elementary schools than their non-economically disadvantaged peers.
- Common reasons for children not attending school include family responsibilities; transportation issues; common illnesses; behavioral issues and/or suspensions.



What is the solution? Providing love, support, skills, encouragement and a host of social and emotional wraparound services to families and children including:

- Dozens of Agape School Connectors working with hundreds of children and their families in elementary, middle and high schools
- Parental engagement, education, support, encouragement, accountability
- Facilitating *nurturing communities* through and on-site presence in apartment communities in under-resourced areas of the city (Frayser, Hickory Hill, and Whitehaven)
- Hundreds of volunteers engaged in after-school; site-based tutoring; mentoring; reading interventions; in-school tutoring; and more
